If using JR, the Shinobazu Gate only has stairs and escalators, so wheelchair or stroller users are better off entering via the Hirokoji Gate.

The path up to Ueno Park from Keisei Ueno Station and the Hirokoji Exit of Ueno Station has stairs and steep slopes. The route from the Park Exit is more easily navigated.
